She also developed practical skills in livestock health and lowstress cattle handling. Moving cattle in smaller increments, for instance, reduced stress and improved mother-calf bonding, resulting in healthier herds. "Knowing and watching your animals is a priority as a rancher," she explained.

The internship opened doors for networking with influential figures, including Wyoming's governor and leading ranchers. "Those connections were inspiring and invaluable," Makenna said.

Now preparing to graduate, Makenna plans to use these lessons to help her family establish a successful ranch. "This experience was a learning process I'll use for years to come," she concluded, praising the GrowinG Internship as a transformative opportunity to grow both personally and professionally.
